

Dust Mopping

Steps

1. As with any floor cleaning procedure, always start in one corner of the room and work your way across the floor.
2. When dry mopping, the mop should never leave the floor. If you lift it up, you risk releasing all of the dust you've just accumulated.
3. Use a continuous swiping motion, either back and forth or in a figure eight dust mop pattern.
4. Always overlap your strokes by at least a few inches to avoid missing any spots.
5. Clean your dust mop by shaking it inside a plastic bag to catch all the dust.
6. Use a broom and dust pan to clean any large debris left behind by your dust mop.
7. Always clean your dust mop when you're finished. Check the label for proper cleaning procedures. Many reusable dust mops can be rinsed and hung up to dry. Disposable ones should be thrown out after each use.
8. Once you've removed the dust from your floor, you can begin the wet mopping process.
